Exciting sculptures intermingle with intriguing plants at the Surrey Sculpture Society's 22nd annual Sculpture Trail at RHS Garden Wisley

2019 is set to be a very special year for the Surrey Sculpture Society (SSS) as it celebrates its 25th Anniversary, and returning to RHS Garden Wisley for the 22nd annual Sculpture Trail from **17th August - 22nd September.**

Henriette van der Does, Chair of the SSS commented: 'The Surrey Sculpture Society is celebrating 25 years of creativity and of course our yearly exhibition at RHS Garden Wisley cannot be missing from our celebratory calendar. Although we have been setting up sculpture trails at Wisley for 22 years now, it never fails to excite us. Wisley is an amazing place where magic can be made between art and nature. The setting is beautiful and offers different areas for different styles or themes of sculpture to be set in the perfect spot, thus enhancing the beauty of both.'

There will be a new route for the sculpture trail this year, created by long term SSS member and sculptor Carol Orwin, who commented: *'For this special year we have designed a very different experience for visitors. We will be incorporating the route down through the Exotic Garden. This is a really exciting addition to the trail allowing for sculptures to intermingle with unusual plants. Visitors can also come and meet the sculptors who are stewarding the event in the Waterlily Pavilion at the end of the Jellecoe Canal.'*

The sculptures are created by the Surrey Sculpture Society's emerging and professional sculptors and visitors will discover a diverse range of works, from abstract to traditional pieces that have been created from a wide selection of materials including bronze, resin, wood, metal, glass, stone and found objects.

The SSS members have created 110 sculptures for the event, which will be thoughtfully positioned throughout the RHS Garden Wisley's 240 acres within 25 inspirational garden settings and all sculptures will be for sale.
